101. Two items for sewing supplies - Must be made (examples: needle case, mending kit, pin cushion)
102. Two accessories made for yourself (examples: scarf, ear warmer, sweatband, belt, tie)
103. Simple article made for travel (examples: tote bag, gym bag, laundry)
104. Simple article made for home (examples: oven mitt, pillow)
105. Simple article made to wear at home in daytime (apron, smock, etc.)
106. Simple article of sleepwear
107. Simple top (knit fabric)
108. Simple top (woven fabric)
109. Simple vest, cape, etc.
110. Simple skirt
111. Simple 2 piece coordinated outfit (top/bottom)
112. Simple dress
113. Pants
114. Shorts
115. Pantskirt or split skirt
116. Garment made by member, worn and cleaned/laundered at least 5 times.
