RULES:

2. Open only to youth organization members enrolled in kindergarten (must be 5 years old) through 2nd grade.
3. No live project animals are to be brought to the Fair in this department.
4. No more than 2 entries may be items made in school for grade or requirement.
5. No premium money will be given - all participants will receive a Cloverbud Ribbon.

7. No migratory feathers, nests or eggs allowed for exhibition.
