

## DEPARTMENT 9 — DOG OBEDIENCE

See Department 10, Class A on page 38 for more opportunities

Judging: Thursday at 2:00 PM

### RULES:

1. All dog exhibits must be the result of regular project work.
2. **ALL** dogs to be exhibited and/or trained must have the following vaccinations with dates vaccinated listed on the official certificate, supplied by your veterinarian. They must be certified by a member of the County 4-H Dog Project Committee at least five (5) days prior to the dog show.
  - a. DHL and Parvo Virus—within one (1) year of trainings/shows.
  - b. Rabies—within three (3) years of training/shows.
  - c. Coronavirus and kennel cough are strongly recommended.
  - d. Heartworm recommended.
3. No prong collars will be permitted in the show.
4. Each member must have trained the dog which he/she enters. Proof of ownership must be presented upon request.
5. Females in season will be allowed to show at County Fair. Dog in season and handler will be judged last so not to upset other dogs. Handler must inform Department Superintendent of situation immediately.
6. Each member may enter 2 dogs, but only ONE animal may be entered in a particular obedience class, and only ONE obedience class may be entered with each dog.
7. All classes will be judged under current American Kennel Club Rules.
8. Entries should be at least one class higher than previously entered with a particular dog. Any dog with an AKC degree must enter at least one class higher than the corresponding AKC class.
9. Pre-Novice A classes are only for members and dogs with no previous experience.
10. Pre-Novice B classes are only for members and dogs with previous training.
11. Any dog entered in Novice or higher may repeat that class a second year if he/she did not receive a qualifying score at the dog show last year.
12. Dogs of special training will not be judged to the standards of AKC.
13. Any child not training with the 4-H training program, must attend two county classes with their dog; six county classes are recommended. 4-H members must attend six county classes. This will familiarize the trainers with the child and dog to provide proper class placement at the county dog show.
14. One team entry per dog or per exhibitor.
15. **Dogs only allowed on fair grounds on day of show or during demonstration.**

## Class A—Showmanship

### RULES:

1. Registration required on Fair Entry Blank.
2. Judging based on:
  - A. Correct showmanship
  - B. Condition of animal for showing
    - (1) Trimming and condition of the dog
    - (2) Cleanliness of the dog
  - C. Danish Judging
3. Anyone earning a top blue ribbon or trophy previously must show in "Open Class."

108. PRE-UTILITY  
Signal exercise; Directed retrieve; Retrieve over high jump; Directed jumping-high jump only; Long stand.
109. UTILITY  
Signal exercise; scent discrimination (leather and metal); Directed retrieve of glove; Directed jumping; Long stand.
110. BRACE PRE-NOVICE  
Two pre-novice dogs shown at same time by one exhibitor, one dog must be from members family.
111. BRACE NOVICE  
Two dogs shown at same time by one exhibitor, one dog must be from members family. If one dog is at Novice, both must be shown at novice Brace.
112. TEAM PRE-NOVICE  
Four dogs shown by four handlers. Three must be shown in pre-novice level, one may be novice or above.
113. TEAM NOVICE  
Four dogs shown by four handlers. At least two must be at novice level or above.
