**RULES:**

1. Age Definitions:
  - A junior kid is born after April 1.
  - A senior kid is born January 1 to March 31.
  - A junior yearling is born July 1 to December 31.
  - A senior yearling is less than 24 months.  
(The above animals shall never have freshened)
  - A milking yearling is under 2 years.
  - A doe, 2 years and under 3 years.
  - A doe, 3 years and under 5 years.
  - A doe, 5 years old and older.  
(The above does must have freshened, including dry milkers)
2. Goats with horns are not permitted in Class B — Dairy Goats, they are permitted in all other classes and in Department 11 classes.
3. Dairy Goats will not be separated into breed classes at this time. All breeds and cross-breeds will be exhibited by age groups.
4. The following vaccinations and/or tests are recommended for exhibitor protection: Negative Brucellosis Test; Negative Tuberculosis Test; Shots for Shipping Fever and Leptospirosis; and use of a regular worming program.
5. Mohair goats will be judged on 60% fleece and 40% breed type.
6. Mohair fleece should be entered in a clear untied plastic bag.

**Class A - Showmanship**

1. Registration for showmanship is required on Entry Blank.
2. Member must show their own animal.
3. Grade levels for Showmanship classes determined as of January 1 of current calendar year.
4. Showmanship Order of Classes: Lot 105, 104, 103, 102, 101, and Show of Champions

## DEPARTMENT 6 — HORSE AND PONY

Exhibitors may also enter Department 10  
Class A, Lots 101-107 on page 38

#### RULES:

1. Exhibitors must provide the original and one copy of their horse's negative Coggins test done after January 1 of current year.
2. Horses must be serviceably sound and in good health to be considered in competition. It is recommended for the protection of all horses that immunizations be given by your veterinarian before coming to the fair. See Animal Health Requirements in this book.
3. No stallion over one year of age may be shown. Any horse shall be considered one year old on the first day of January following the actual day of foaling.
4. Only one horse may be exhibited per member, unless member is participating in Double Hitch Driving, in which case, the member may bring two (2) horses. Only one (1) horse may be used in other classes and must be specified on declaration.
5. A mare with foal at side may be brought to the fair. No special provisions will be made. Only one stall will be allowed.
6. Exhibitors are required to lead their horses at a walk to the exercise area and/or show area.

7. Exhibitors are required to wear boots, hard soled shoes with heels, or other equestrian footwear whenever handling or riding their horses.
8. Exhibitors are required to wear ASTM/SEI approved equestrian helmets with safety harness securely fastened at all times whenever riding or driving their horses
9. Exercising schedules will be announced and posted in each barn.
10. Any equine 56" and under may be entered as a pony. If measurement is in question, contact fair Horse Superintendent. A pony is eligible to show in Pony classes, Horseless Horse classes, Walk/Trot classes, Trail classes, Gymkhana classes, and an appropriate Halter class.
11. Exhibitors who enter a walk/trot class may not enter any canter classes.
12. All horsemanship, equitation, showmanship and reinsmanship classes may be required to do a pattern.
13. One horse may be shown by two exhibitors of the same family. Each exhibitor may show the horse in their appropriate showmanship class and horsemanship class. The horse may be shown in only one Class D-Halter class and only one Class C-Pleasure class and only one Class E-Trail class.
14. Horseless Horse exhibitors may show only one other exhibitor's horse. Only one Horseless Horse exhibitor per horse is allowed. Horseless Horse exhibitors may enter only Horseless Horse classes and Class D-Halter. Horseless Horse is walk/trot only.
15. Only blue ribbon winners exhibiting as 4-H members (in grades 6 - 13 as of January 1 of the current year) are eligible to compete in classes at the Wisconsin State 4-H Horse Expo. This does not include winners in Walk/Trot classes, Class D-Halter classes, and Class F-Gymkhana classes. Blue ribbon winners who exhibit as a FFA member or any other association member are not eligible to compete at the Wisconsin State 4-H Horse Expo.
16. Mules and donkeys may exhibit in any Horse/Pony class as determined by the animals height and the exhibitor or animal age.

**Note: The following rules apply specifically to 4-H Horse & Pony project members and are requirements related to being able to exhibit a horse at fair. Refer to 4-H Horse & Pony project book for further details.**

17. 4-H exhibitors must attend a minimum of (2) 4-H Horse & Pony Project sanctioned educational opportunities, (2) 4-H Horse & Pony Project monthly meetings, as well as work (6) volunteer hours at 4-H Horse & Pony Project sanctioned events, and complete the 4-H Horse and Pony project declaration form to Exhibit at Fair.
