- Each market animal must be entered on entry form.
- Grade levels for showmanship classes determined as of January 1 of current calendar year.

RULES:

- Age Definitions (2008):
 - A spring lamb is born on or after February 16 2008.
 - A winter lamb is born between January 1 and February 15 2008.
 - A fall lamb is born between September 1 and December 31 2007.
 - A yearling lamb is born between February 16 and August 31 2007.
 - A mature ewe is born before February 16 2007.
 - A market lamb is born after January 1 2008.
- Age Definitions (2009):
 - A spring lamb is born on or after February 16 2009.
 - A winter lamb is born between January 1 and February 15 2009.
 - A fall lamb is born between September 1 and December 31 2008.
 - A yearling lamb is born between February 16 and August 31 2008.
 - A mature ewe is born before February 16 2008.
 - A market lamb is born after January 1 2009.
- Exhibitors must clear health requirements with Department Superintendent upon arrival. Must be accompanied by a Wisconsin Intrastate Movement certificate. All ewes and rams of any age must have an official scrapie identification ear tag even if they originate in Wisconsin. No official scrapie identification is required for wethers.
- Animals that are entered in the breed classes must show proof of registration to Department Superintendent upon arrival.**
- All market lambs will be weighed on entry day. Weight classes will be determined by Meat Animal Project Committee and/or department superintendent at the county fair final weigh-in. NOTE: Please enter only as many animals as you are showing. Your animal(s) will be assigned a class.
- All wool breeds will be shown with 2 inches of fleece or less. All other breeds shall be shown with not more than 1 inch of fleece on any part of the animal's body. All fleeces must have been shorn within the past 12 months.
- Market lambs must be shorn so that they are carrying no more than 3/8 inch of wool or less.
- Each market animal must be entered on entry form.
