

GENERAL RULES FOR ALL PULLERS

1. **Safety first! Always think safety, always act safely. Drive slowly, look around and think of others.**
2. Tractors can pull in only one class.
3. **NO CARRY INS ALLOWED!**
4. Two wristband passes per paid tractor entry fee. Wristbands are for grounds admission only, carnival rides are extra.
5. All contestants enter at their own risk
6. Order of pull within each class will be determined by lottery drawing at registration. All tractors must post pull number on side of tractor.
7. Drivers must be age 13 or over. Age 14-18 must have written permission from parents or guardians to enter tractor pull and present a farm safety course certification. Drivers must be 18 or over to drive in open or un-paced classes.
8. Driver must remain in seat at all times and operate the tractor in a safe manner at all times on and off the track.
9. Kill switches, wheelie bars and fenders are highly recommended but not mandatory except in un-paced classes. Wheelie bars must be strong enough to hold tractor when tested. If no wheelie bars, the tractor will be flagged to stop when the front wheels exceed knee high above the ground.
10. All tires must be on the tractor, no tracks allowed.
11. All tractors will be weighed and drawbar checked as you line up for your class, any tractor can be re-weighed after pull by promoter's request.
12. The pull will start with a tight hook-up; **NO JERKING!**
13. If anything falls off the tractor before it is unhooked from the eliminator, the tractor is disqualified.
14. The officials have the right to stop any entry at any time during the pull. Pay attention to the officials, their word is final.
15. Any tractor violating track boundary will be measured from that point if they stop promptly, otherwise, it will be DQ'd.
16. Drawbar height not to exceed 20" for all classes. Drawbar must be at least 18" back of center of rear axle. Drawbar must be rigid in all directions (**NO FLOATING DRAWBARS!**).
17. Tractors must be equipped with a 2 ½" clevis or pulling eye. Height will be checked on scale.
18. Only one pull per weight class per tractor unless a tie requiring a pull-off or sled reset.
19. No alcohol may be consumed by drivers before or during pulling a tractor.
20. All drivers are to be in line and ready to pull at the start of their weight class.
21. No registrations after the start of each respective class.
22. Official decisions made at drivers meeting take priority over printed rules.
23. Paced classes will be paced with a speedometer on the sled and a horn sounding when speeding, after the 100 foot cone, any horn blowing will result in a DQ.
24. **HAVE FUN: THAT IS WHAT WE ARE ALL HERE FOR!!!!!!**

Additional Rules for Farm Classes

1. Tractor must be 1960 or newer if from outside Winnebago County, Wisconsin.
2. RPM's will be stock in farm classes, 3000 in special classes. They will be checked with a hand tach if in question.
3. Tires: 18.4x38 up to 8500, any size after 8500. No cuts of any kind.
4. Weights: weights may not extend more than 24" in front of the tractor casting and in the back; the weight can be any reasonable distance. All weights must be securely fastened and not interfere with the hook up of the tractor to the sled.
5. Drawbar height: 20" in all classes (rigid in all directions).
6. Stock core injection pump in all classes, including special classes.
7. Pace: paced classes will be paced at 4mph, you have 100 feet to set your speed after the 100' cone, if horn blows you will be DQ'd.
8. No nitrous, alcohol or ether allowed, stock fuel only.
9. Farm class tractors are to have a working PTO and hydraulics if equipped from the factory.
10. No water injection in farm class.
11. Turbo: 2.0" inducer max in 7500 special class, engine must be less than 320 cubic inches. 2.75" inducer in all the other classes including heavier specials. No reducer sleeves.

SPECIAL FARM RULES

1. RPM'S will be 3000 in special classes. Special class tractors will be plugged into eliminator to monitor RPM's. Tractors must have visible wires from the sending unit to the plug, and plug must be accessible to back of tractor. The plug on the back of the tractor must be female.
2. Tires: 18.4x38 up to 7500, any size after 7500. No cuts of any kind.
3. Weights: Weights may not extend more than 24" in front of tractor casting. In the back, the weight can be any reasonable distance. All weights must be securely fastened and not interfere with the hook up of the tractor to the sled.
4. Drawbar height: 20" in all classes (rigid in all directions).
5. No nitrous, alcohol or ether allowed, stock fuel only.
6. Turbo: 2.0" inducer max in 7500 special class, engine must be less than 320 cubic inches.
7. Special and Open Classes need to have safety equipment; air shut offs, wheelie bars, and cross bolts in exhaust pipe.
8. Protests must be filed in writing by any pulling member of the same class and given to a track official within 10 minutes after class if over.
9. If a class member of the same class wants to protest, the protestor puts up \$100 and the vehicle being protested puts up \$100 before being tested. The protest fee of \$200 is given to the protested if not found illegal. If found illegal, the \$200 goes to the Winnebago County Fair Association General Fund.
10. If a protest is filed in writing at an event, the protested vehicle/ driver will be immediately notified as to the protest. At that point the pulling vehicle and the driver must remain at the event to determine the results of the protest. If the pulling vehicle and/ or driver leave before being tested, the pulling vehicle and driver will be considered illegal.
